There are currently over 300 head of animals there. Any attempts to educate on not getting to many animals or raising funds has not been well received. Different members of our board has visited there, all agree the animals are well cared for. A couple of boards are going to make contact with Joe to see if there is anything that can be done to assist his efforts. At this time the board has agreed to wait.
