
Trail and Facility Information

Location:

7 miles east of Bishopville, SC 1 mile off I-20 (exit 123). 15 miles from Hartsville on Hwy 15.

Type:

Day and/or overnight use. Riders coming for the day will pay no entrance fee. There is a donation box located at the park entrance.

Facilities:

23 horse camping sites with electric hookup (50 amp) and water with access to restrooms and showers.

Campsites can be reserved in advance at 1-866-345-7275, www.SouthCarolinaParks.com or the park office.

Corrals are available for rent in the campground and can be reserved. A ten stall barn at the show ring available for rent on a first come first serve basis.

For events at show ring call park office at (803) 428-5307.

Our gift shop with equestrian items is located at the Park Education Center in the day use area (only trailered horses allowed in day use area).

Trails:

- 4.6 miles on Loop Rd. along Lynches River (easy).
- 3.3 miles on main horse trail (moderate).
- 2.1 miles of cut-through trails (moderate).

Lee STATE PARK'S HORSE TRAILS



Lee State Park sits along the winding and scenic Lynches River. The park's twelve miles of trails provide a rider with the chance to view the wonders of the sandy coastal plains of South Carolina as well as the wetlands along the beautiful Lynches River. As riders follow the sandy trails through enormous longleaf pines, they will see a variety of different species of plants and animals. White-tailed deer are common. Along the Loop Road, riders will parallel the Lynches River, seeing many wetland species of plant and animal like river oats and the colorful wood duck.

Horse Trail Rules and Regulations

- Trail users should always remain on designated trails as marked by signs or brochures.
- Horses must be confined to Loop Road, bridle trails, show ring area and the equestrian campground.
- Motorized vehicles are not permitted on park trails.
- Pets are allowed on trails but must remain on a leash, not longer than six feet in length, at all times. The pet owner must remove pet waste from trails.
- Please do not tie leads directly to park trees.
- Please do not cut or damage any trees or plants.
- If you build a fire at your campsite, please make sure it is manageable and do not leave it unattended.
- Always be courteous to other trail users.
- Help the park staff maintain trails by picking up any litter and report any trail needs to the park office.
- All riders must have proof of current one year negative Coggins test.
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in SC State Parks.
